While Sony is likely to show a mix of third-party and first-class names, the company has yet to reveal exactly what those names will be. We may have a hint, however, courtesy of the lead developer on the 2018 hit God of War. Jeet Shroff, director of gameplay at Sony Santa Monica Studios, was an engineering leader on God of War (2018), a sequel/soft reboot in Sony's long-running decidal action series. And while it's certainly not impossible, it's also worth noting that Schruff hasn't said anything about God of war, and that historically speaking, we're not exactly connected to God's new game of war just yet. First, if we take Schrouf's tweet by volume, then yes, Sony Santa Monica will have a presence at the PS5 event. (If Shroff didn't mean us as a larger Community of PlayStation developers, that's also possible.) This could mean a new game of God of war. It could also mean that someone on the team wants to share common programming insights, or that the team is working on a new IP, or that the older God of War game will get a port to showcase some ps5 feature or other. (God of War III came to PS4 to demonstrate that the system increased frame rate, among other things.) If Sony does show a new game of God of War, fans should keep in mind that this may not be the name of the launch.
